Do you know someone that spends too much time on an electronic device? Do you wonder if someone you know has no self-control with such a device and it's affecting his/her life in a negative way? According to researchers, Kwon, Chung, and Lee, the problem is not rooted in technology but with relationships. Children and adults with the highest risk score high on the following variables: escape from self, negative mood, perceived parent hostility/lack of affection, low parental supervision, lack of supportive peer relationships. It always comes down to communication, communication, and communication.
