# Math

Wow! We are learning so much during our math time each day. We are going to be amazing mathematicians by the time we leave third grade! :) Here are some highlights of what we have been learning during math:

\*Checking subtraction with addition (Addition and subtraction go together; they are the opposite/inverse of one another.)

\*Estimating an addition or subtraction sentence first before solving to make sure the answer is reasonable.

\*Using our CUBES strategy to solve word problems (turquoise pages in binder).

\*Mental Math

\*Combine Place Values Strategy/Box-It Method: Look at the ones and tens together or the tens and hundreds together so that you don't need to regroup. This is very helpful when we have zeroes in the ones and tens places.

\*2-Step Word Problems/Situations Strategy:

- 1. Number the parts, read the problem, and do CUBES as always.
- 2. If the problem has three numbers <u>and</u> one object, animal, place, people.

you will need to have two number sentences.

3. 1<sup>st</sup> sentence: addition (most of the time)

2<sup>nd</sup> sentence: subtraction



## Our Amazing Brain

We have been talking a lot about how our brain likes to learn (Ex. hearing, seeing, talking, and making gestures). Our brain and our capabilities are almost endless. This week we learned that our brains control everything we do. The brain has five parts that do all kinds of different jobs. During this time of our lives (magic decade), our brains are stretching and growing all the time. Learning from our mistakes is one way our brains learn and grow. When we learn, the neurons in our brains are "firing", connecting, and making our brains stretch and get stronger which allow our brains to hold more information and ideas. We are "neurosculptors" shaping, changing, and making our brains smarter every day!



## Curriculum Snapshots!

# Language Arts

Our class has been working hard reviewing and learning new grammar skills. Prefixes and suffixes are important as they can change a root word's meaning, spelling, and pronunciation. Knowledge of these word parts also help us be better decoders and therefore better at comprehending what we are reading. Another important skill is understanding the difference between subjects and predicates. A subject is the first part of the sentence and tells us who/what the sentence is about. The predicate starts with the verb and includes everything else in the sentence. It tells what the subject is doing.

We also started our official work in Benchmark Advance. It continues the same structure from second grade. Our first unit is *Government for all People*. We will be learning vocabulary, spelling patterns, and comprehension strategies and skills. Each unit is three weeks long, but will in general be a little bit longer than that with the earlier units. During the first few units, we will be doing a lot of work together and there will be lots of teacher support even with weekly comprehension assessments. It's important that students stay focused during instruction and mirror what they see on the screen on all papers, booklets, etc.

Your child should be practicing the sight syllables (orange page in binder) every day to increase improvement in decoding and fluency.

## Accelerated Reader Update

Students should have a <u>vocabulary</u> of 60,000 words or more by the end of twelfth grade. These are words that students use not only in their speaking, but in their reading <u>and</u> writing. In order to meet that goal, students need to read <u>a lot</u> every day.
